Primary Examination Codes

- 7 Patient new to practice (no access to patient's record) OR Patient not new to the practice but the optometrist or ophthalmic medical practitioner does not have access to the patient record created as a result of a primary eye examination carried out at another practice within the relevant primary eye examination frequency
- 8 To be used when patient has turned 16 years of age resulting in a change in frequency between primary eye examinations from annually to biennially
